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20 To the Clerk of the Court and Honorable Judge Micheal Strickroth, Appellant, Corey Eib submits his
21 Opening Brief to the court.
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1 **INTRODUCTION:**

2 Appellant Corey Eib has withdrawn consent to the waivers of rights associated with possessing and
3 carrying CA DMV license or ID card and continued participation in the CA DMV program.
4

5 The CA DMV has abused its discretion and has failed to remove, delete or update the record in the CA
6 State Computer system to reflect the waivers of rights, previously held in favor of the State, are no
7 longer valid.
8

9 **STATEMENT OF FACTS:**

10 Appellant Corey Eib is a natural born citizen of California (See CA Gov. Code 241a, U.S. Const.. Art
11 IV, §2, Cl. 1.).
12

13 The CA DMV is an administrative agency of a State of the United States and was created by authority of
14 the Vehicle Act of 1915.
15

16 In January of 2010, Appellant, Corey Eib notified the CA DMV in writing of his decision to rescind the
17 waivers of rights associated with CA DMV Form DL44, and returned the license card in his possession
18 to the CA DMV. In February of 2010, the CA DMV responded in writing stating the License Card had
19 been destroyed, and the license account closed. The CA State Computer system was not updated to
20 reflect the waivers of rights held in favor of the State, were no longer valid.
21

22 The CA DMV continues to hold over Appellant the civil obligations associated with an individual
23 voluntarily waiving rights to participate in the CA DMV Program, claiming to have discretion over such
24 matters involving participation in the CA DMV program.
25

26 Subsequently, the Appellant was charged with a vehicle code violation in Los Angeles Superior Court
27 by CA CHP. During this matter, the court assigned an attorney to represent the Appellant against his
28 will. That attorney, without consent, waived rights in favor of the State, then terminated representation.

1 During this court proceeding, the Appellant was not permitted to maintain his own defense, or even
2 speak on his own behalf in the case. The Court maintained willful blindness to the abuse of the
3 Constitutional rights against Appellant, and under threat of incarceration, Appellant was coerced into
4 signing CA DMV Form DL44 as a condition of all charges and threat of incarceration being dropped.
5

6 Appellant has not consented to participation, or the waivers of rights associated with participation in the
7 CA DMV program or those waivers stated in CA DMV Form DL44.
8

9 **STATEMENT OF THE CASE:**

10 On January 30, 2023 Appellant filed his complaint in the form of a Writ of Mandate, seeking a court
11 order to have the license card destroyed, update to the CA State Computer system to delete the
12 Appellant's record or include information reflecting the consent for waiver of rights has been rescinded
13 and no longer are waived in favor of the State.
14

15 On January 31st, 2023 the Orange County Superior Court docketed the complaint.

16 On March 29, 2023 Appellant filed a Motion for Default Judgment.

17 On June 2, 2023 the CA DMV filed its Answer.

18 On June 29, 2023 Appellant filed a Response to CA DMV Opposition to Default Judgment.

19 On July 31, 2023 the Court issued it's Denial Order for Appellant's Motion for Default Judgment and set
20 the matter for trial date of December 8, 2023 at 9:00 am in Dept 15.
21

22 **ISSUE PRESENTED**

23 The issue presented asks this Court to provide guidance on whether Appellant's continued participation
24 in the CA DMV program, and the waivers of rights associated with CA DMV Form DL44 remain
25 voluntary or not voluntary after Appellant has consented to participate in the CA DMV license/ID
26 program.
27
28

1 **STANDARD OF REVIEW**

2 The standard of review for the Court is to determine if the CA DMV abused its discretion by
3 acknowledging Appellant's withdrawal of consent, then canceled Appellant's license card but maintained
4 Appellant's information in the CA State Computer System, where the waivers of rights associated with
5 CA DMV Form DL44 are continued to be held over and enforceable upon Appellant despite Appellant's
6 withdrawal of consent to participate in the CA DMV program.

7
8 **ARGUMENT**

9 Appellant is a natural born Citizen of California (CA Gov. Code 241a, U.S. Const., Art. IV, §2, Cl. 1),
10 and does not consent to the waivers of rights associated with possessing a CA DMV license card.
11 Appellant notified the CA DMV of his rescission of consent and has been held in the CA DMV license
12 program without his consent since January of 2010.

13
14 The CA DMV is an agency of a State of the United States (See Respondent's Answer, Page 1, line 25),
15 and has created an application (CA DMV Form DL44) which includes a number of 'certifications'
16 which include significant waivers of rights in favor of the State in exchange for a CA DMV license or
17 ID card.

18
19 These waivers create civil obligations to the State and the United States which can be held over the
20 applicant. These include civil obligations which otherwise would not be permitted by law. By holding
21 these waivers, and maintaining Appellant in the State Computer System without notification to the
22 Courts, Executive Officers of the State and any other authority with access to the State Computer
23 System, that waivers of rights originally agreed to by the Appellant are no longer valid. The civil
24 obligations associated with these waivers and held over Appellant, are in violation of U.S. Const.,
25 Amend 13, applicable to the CA DMV by U.S. Const. Amend 14. ("it has long been settled that the
26 Thirteenth Amendment "is not a mere prohibition of State laws establishing or upholding slavery, but an
27 absolute declaration that slavery or involuntary servitude shall not exist in any part of the United States."
28 *Civil Rights Cases*, 109 U.S. 3, 20." *Memphis v. Greene* (1981) 451 U.S. 100, 120)

1 The CA DMV has a history of abusing the spirit and authority of the Judicial branch by exploiting the
2 voluntary nature of the CA DMV license scheme. The CA DMV accomplishes this abuse by simply
3 changing CA DMV Form DL44 anytime this agency wants to essentially veto a Court decision that the
4 CA State, or the CA DMV does not like. For example the United States Supreme Court ruled that a
5 search warrant must be obtained to draw blood from an individual, (Birchfield v. North Dakota (2016)
6 136 S. Ct. 2160) . To get around and essentially veto this court decision the CA DMV Form DL44 was
7 modified to include in the 'Certifications' section verbiage with waives this right in favor of the State,
8 transferring the authority to draw blood from the SCOTUS decision upholding the 4th Amendment to
9 the policy of the local or state law enforcement agency making contact with an individual. It is not hard
10 to understand that if the CA DMV has the authority and discretion to create any changes in the Form
11 DL44 application it wants, and to make changes to that application at any time after an individual agrees
12 to these certification which then can be held over non-consenting participants in the program, the CA
13 DMV retains plenary authority to essentially overturn any Court decision it deems problematic. Such a
14 situation creates a very dangerous situation where the executive branch of government can render moot
15 any decision handed down by SCOTUS, or any other Court which has jurisdiction over the CA DMV by
16 simply changing CA DMV Form DL44 as it sees fit.

17

18 By holding over Appellant the conditions in Form DL44, and maintaining Appellant's information in the
19 State Computer system without including information that waivers have been rescinded, the CA DMV
20 enriches itself unjustly by charging Appellant for Vehicle Registration fees, and License fees to which
21 Appellant would otherwise not be obligated to pay. This unlawful action also enriches the state by
22 subjecting Appellant to civil obligations in favor of the State that Appellant would not otherwise be
23 obligated to pay.

24

25 Maintaining Appellant's information in the State Computer system, without notice to Authorities
26 authorized to access the CA State Computer system that the waivers of rights held over Appellant have
27 been rescinded also violates U.S. Const., Amend 7, applicable to the CA DMV by U.S. Const., Amend
28 14. In the case of a parking ticket, or vehicle code infraction, Appellant is subject to civil obligations

1 without a jury trial which exceed \$20 against his will and without his consent.

2
3 Maintaining Appellant's information in the State Computer system also violates U.S. Const., Amend 2,
4 applicable to the CA DMV by U.S. Const. Amend 14. Appellant is a natural born 4th Article citizen of
5 California, and as such has the obligation to serve in the State Militia when called by the proper
6 authority. The normal mode of transportation today, which Appellant would use if called to service in
7 the militia, is his automobile (See U.S.C. Title 1, §4). Through the CA DMV license scheme,
8 Appellant's automobile is then determined by the State to be a motor vehicle (See CA Veh. Code 415a,
9 Cal. Veh. Code 21052, U.S.C. Title 18, Chpt 2, §32a(6)), giving near plenary power of the State to
10 regulate and infringe Appellant's use of his personal property to respond and travel wherever he may be
11 called to serve in the Militia of California. This infringement of the Second Amendment also extends to
12 any vehicle Appellant may use, not just his private automobile. By holding Appellant in the CA DMV
13 program without consent, the State maintains the ability regulate Appellant's travel via the CA DMV
14 license scheme controlling when, how, where and by what conditions Appellant may use the roads and
15 highways of California in his, or any other automobile. ("the threat that the new Federal Government
16 would destroy the citizens' militia by taking away their arms was *the* reason that right ... was codified in
17 a written Constitution." *District of Columbia et al. v. Heller* (2008) 554 U.S. 570, 714)

18
19 The CA DMV violates U.S. Const., Amend 10, applicable to the CA DMV by U.S. Const., Amend 14.
20 There is no constitutional authority granted to the United States to hold Citizens of the Several States in
21 a program against their will, where participation in said program requires waivers of Constitutional
22 rights.



24 The CA DMV violates U.S. Const., Art. IV, §2, Cl. 1, applicable to the CA DMV by U.S. Const.,
25 Amend 14. One of the many waivers of rights in CA DMV Form DL44 includes the statement that the
26 applicant's "presence in the United States is authorized under Federal Law." As Appellants presence in
27 the United States, as it operates within the boundaries of California (See Cal. Const., Art 3. §2) is
28 without consent, appellant is denied the right of Comity within the borders of California, and every other

1 one of the Several States, reducing Appellant's status to that of a resident without direct access to the
2 Constitution or the Bill of Rights. ("The privileges and immunities clause of the Fourteenth Amendment
3 protects very few rights because it neither incorporates any of the Bill of Rights nor protects all rights of
4 individual citizens" *Jones v. Temmer* (D. Colo. 1993) 829 F. Supp. 1226, 1232)

5
6 **CONCLUSION**

7 Appellant is a natural born 4th Article Citizen of California and does not consent to participate in the CA
8 DMV program, nor does Appellant consent to the waivers of rights contained in CA DMV Form DL44.
9 Appellant has properly notified the CA DMV of his rescission of consent and returned the license card.
10 The CA DMV Continues to provide false information in the State Computer system, chiefly that the
11 waivers of rights previously held by the State continue to be valid.

12 The CA DMV has abused it's discretion by maintaining Appellant's participation in the program without
13 consent, statutory authority or constitutional authority to do so. Appellant demands this court find in
14 favor of Appellant and order the CA DMV to destroy the license card in his possession (or deface the
15 license card and return the defaced license card to the Appellant as his personal property), close
16 Appellants license account so that Appellant's information in the CA State computer system is either
17 removed, or updated to reflect the State no longer holds the waivers of rights contained in CA DMV
18 Form DL44, and to order the CA DMV to create a fair and transparent process by which a participant in
19 the program can return a license or ID card, and terminate the waivers of rights previously agreed to on
20 the application for the license or ID card.

- Unexpired Employment Authorization Document (EAD) Card (I-766) or valid/expired EAD Card with Notice of Action (I-797 C).

- **Two** documents that prove you live in California.
